to mention were our photographers who willingly gave their time taking photos of the models, such as Udo, Vincent, Lina & Vicky Gaither. Vicky even helped promote our show through the International Radio Connection which brought more people to our show.

As an organization, we are celebrating the 7th year of the Monthly Potluck dinner as part of the Newcomers Network activities. Our funding from the Newcomers Network was stopped 3 years ago, but as an organization, we have decided to continue it, due to the impact it was making on our visitors, migrants and refugees in the city. We have seen the support to partners of Massey post graduate students, PACE and IPU students that the Network brings to

overcome their isolation and help develop their English Language speaking skills. Our monthly dinner has become a social connector among families that regularly come here and meet new contacts, who may later become friends. It has created a sense of belonging and community among migrants.

At our last month's potluck dinner we said our goodbyes to a Brazilian family who expressed their sadness at leaving, their sons said they would like to come back one day to New Zealand to study or work.

Also this month our staff and one of the committee members received a letter from a lady In Spain who used to regularly come to our English classes and to our potluck dinners. She expressed her aratitude to our staff. She also wishes one day to return to New Zealand.



President Report continues

In our Language Classes we celebrated with our two former volunteers who now have full time jobs. We valued their time with us and the time they spent with other migrants sharing their English knowledge. Truly, volunteering is a good stepping stone in getting a job here in New Zealand.

To all Christians, it is an important date as it is the celebration of Easter, a time of reflection that Good things can happen out of bad things. Jesus Christ's resurrection was a good illustration of that, it became a reality for me, last Easter Monday.

I was asked to work in one of the respite homes and to my surprise the lady working there as a Team Leader, was a former Congolese refugee that I had welcomed through our settlement support project in 2006. We had a good catch up on how her life turned out after she arrived Palmerston North. From being a solo mum and losing her husband through conflicts in the Congo, she is now remarried and has 2 children. Through her current job, she was able to sponsor her two remaining adult children in the Congo to come here.

I returned home very happy after listening to her story of hope. As a country, we celebrate Anzac Day, to remember the fallen soldiers, servicemen and survivors who served during the two World Wars. To me and my family it is a very important day as some of my husband's uncles served and were killed during the wars. His mom also served as a surgical nurse in Egypt.

At the Multicultural Manawatu we were able to show our gratitude by laying a wreath for the 2nd year in a row. I am very thankful that there are talented people in our team who are keen to crochet poppies. Thank you Booranee.

We also had a meeting with Peter and Pascal from the City Council, who updated us with our contract.

This week, as well as our regular Potluck Dinner on Friday night, the Bhutanese Community had their Cultural Show on Saturday 29th at the Rangiora Hall.

Sunday was the opening of the Chinese Gazebo at the Kelvin Grove Cemetery followed by a Potluck lunch at the Chinese hall.

On 5th of May at 7 pm, The Chinese Community are showing The Quintessence of Chinese Culture at the Spiers Centre, Palmerston North Boys High School 263 Featherston Street.

We hope to have a good attendance at our executive and council meeting on May 11th.

On May 19th at 6;30 pm the Egyptian community will be running a cultural show at the Library and on May 16, we will be working collaboratively with Just Zilch and Palmerston North Environmental Trust, showing a documentary film, The Theatre of Life .

Truly life is busy but rewarding when you know it is helping to make this city a better place to live.
