Rangitane elders Wiremu and Trieste Te Awe Awe also marked the opening of the function with a karakia and waiata.

The vision of the Manawatu Malaysian Society is to create a "home away from home" environment in the Manawatu, where people of Malaysian descents can share and celebrate the uniqueness of the Malaysian culture, and to support and unite all Malaysians in the community.

With the current Welcoming Communities pilot scheme in Palmerston North, the Manawatu Malaysian Society look forward to playing an active role in welcoming new Malaysians to Palmerston North and help to create a strong and positive community in Palmerston North and the wider region.
