



Volunteer Recognition Night


On Friday 15th June, the Volunteer Resources Centre, a charitable trust that supports and promotes volunteering in all forms, organised a wonderful evening to acknowledge the many volunteers who selflessly give their time and skills to the community. The event was held at the Convention Centre and was attended

by many people from the community including Mayor Grant Smith and City councillors. MMC being one of the many community organisations that relies on volunteers to run programmes and events, nominated two of our wonderful volunteers:

Meriam Findlay for the Long Service Award.

Meriam Findlay began her involvement with the Manawatu Multicultural Council (MMC) in 1993 being one of the audience at the International Day which later became the Festival of Cultures.

In 1997 Meriam was the representative of the Philippines Association (PCA), on the Manawatu Multicultural Council. In her involvement with MMC, Meriam met and helped people from all ethnicities overcome isolation, discrimination and lack of employment.



In 2004 Meriam became the President of MMC and in that year MMC became the host organisation for the Settlement Support Project, thanks to the successful application that Meriam and other Executive members of the MMC at that time submitted to Immigration NZ. After 2 years, Meriam stepped down as President to look after her growing family but continued to be involved as Immediate Past President and later on as a Committee Member. In 2015, Meriam came back to serve again as President.

Meriam is a great support to her husband who is a well-known in the Palmerston North community, as well as working as a part time carer and looking after her family. Meriam is well known to literally hundreds of people, both migrants, refugees and local people and is always spoken highly of.

Being the President of the Manawatu Multicultural Council, amongst her numerous duties, she also finds time to write a monthly report on the workings of the Council in the MMC's newsletter.

Somehow she finds time to attend an incredible amount of community events that she is invited to. Meriam is truly a community person willing to go the extra mile to help other people especially migrants and refugees settling in our city.

Eh Taw for the Migrants Sector Award.

Being a young mum looking after her baby doesn't prevent EH Taw from helping her Karen Community. Her community is made of former refugees, originally from Myanmar.



Volunteer Recognition Night

Most of the refugees lived all their lives in refugee camps with no access to education until they came to NZ. As a consequence, resettlement not easy especially when it comes to finding jobs often without English. Eh Taw helps them with WINZ, Housing, the GP's, the hospital, shopping, schools, even babysitting when required. With her help out of nine families 7 secured employment.

For the other 2 families only the husbands found a job. A" pop shop "at the Library allowed the Karen women to show their weaving skills and gain some exposure. This allowed some women to find a full time job at the knitting mills.

The Karen Youth won the EthKick tournament for many years in raw and they went on to compete in the national tournament in Auckland.

The MMC is very grateful for all our volunteers for all your time, effort, hard work, helping migrants and refugees resettle in our City.

World Refuge Day 2018

On Saturday 23rd of June, Manawatu Refugee Voice and Red Cross celebrated World Refugee Day in style with speeches, songs, dance and food at the Convention Centre.

Manawatu Refugee Voice Chairman Jean Christophe Massimba said no-one had ever chosen to be a refugee, but nearly 50 million people found themselves with that status because of persecution, war and violence.

He highlighted the situation in Syria, Sudan, and Iraq as countries in conflict and where thousands of people faced difficult decisions about becoming displaced for a chance in a foreign country. Jean-Christophe welcomed the wonderful government decision to increase the refugee quota to 1000 for the first time since 1980.

Few minutes of silence were observed to remember the many refugees who suffer the consequences of war and conflicts or die trying to cross dangerous seas for a safe place.

Hon. Iain Les Galloway, Minister of Immigration in his speech he said: "This week the world has been celebrating former refugees who are contributing to their new communities in thousands of ways

On Wednesday we celebrated World Refugee Day at Parliament and today we did so here in Palmerston North. I feel incredibly privileged to be embraced by these wonderful people"

Mayor Grant Smith said Palmerston North is very proud of its multiculturalism which enriches our community.

There were also amazing success stories from former refugees who expressed their gratitude for the local community for welcoming them and supporting them on their journey to resettlement

Kevin Morris representing Red Cross said that Red Cross feels privileged to be part of the welcoming committee for former refugees and is pleased that the local community has joined in providing a friendly welcome to their new neighbours.



Beautiful performances by former refugees were also on the programme followed by amazing culinary dishes from various cultures represented in the former refugee's community.




